

Sustainability Focus

The end of the year means a lot of different things for different people. For many it's a time of gift giving and Christmas cheer. While this is a great time of year filled with joy and happiness, unfortunately, the reality can be very different. Tonnes of wrapping and packaging for our Christmas presents ends up in landfill, dumped or recycled incorrectly.

However, we can all work together and take little steps to help reduce our waste and plastic consumption to protect the environment!

This was the theme for our Staff Sustainable activity and termly Sustainability Week here at Funhouse. We demonstrated this by focussing on the creation of Beeswax Wraps as an alternative to plastic wrapping to communicate with the kids and staff, it is possible to be sustainable this Christmas. These wraps can be used as an alternative to cling wrap and foil to help preserve food and other perishables. We hope this activity can inspire you to help make a small change which will have a great sustainable impact.





Funhouse is still collecting Bread Tags for Bread tags for Wheelchairs. This local organisation recycles the tags donated and turns them into products to be sold in Australia. The funds are then donated to help people in South Africa who are unable to afford wheelchairs. An amazing way to teach that small recycling efforts can still create a big change in someone's life!

Be You offers information and resources specifically designed for Educators on specific mental health-related topics. At Castle Hill Funhouse, the team is engaging with different modules and meet termly to consolidate information in the Funhouse context.

This month, the team focused on Empowerment in Childhood.

This involved understanding that hildren have the capacity for expression, decision-making, exploring ideas with their peers and directing their learning. They're increasingly able to express their likes and dislikes, make choices about who and what they want to play with, and contribute ideas about their learning experiences.

Transition strategies – which involve early learning services, schools and home – support continued growth of self-determination when they highlight children's opportunities to make choices and manage their learning.
